Combined with the shift to digital cinematography, as well as the rise of comic book and franchise cinema, the temptation to augment movies with lavish, computer generated spectacle has proven irresistible to both directors and audiences, to the point that, Dixon argues, 21st-century commercial cinema is so far removed from the real world that it has created a new era of flawless, fake movies. Included in this book are reviews of the 5 best horror films for each year between 2000 and 2020, and reviews of the top 10 horror movies released in the same period. Each entry includes a picture of the antagonist, a star rating, a synopsis, and a three-paragraph review. Motion pictures are more than just entertainment. In film studies courses in colleges and universities worldwide, students and professors explore the social, political, technological and historical implications of cinema. This textbook provides two things: the history of film as an art form and an analysis of its impact on society and politics. Chapters are arranged chronologically, covering the major developments in film, like the advent of talkies or the French New Wave. Intolerance while studying the innovations made by D.W. Griffith from 1910 to 1919.
